- The Alzheimer Society of Chatham-Kent opened its doors to the public, began doing referrals at retirement homes and home visits.
- Education is being facilitated virtually, as well as within the community.
- We expanded our In-Home Respite team, now having a complement of 8 PSW staff.
- Our Day Program numbers continued to increase throughout the year.
- We are moving forward with offering more Nursing support for Day Program clients, to avoid unnecessary
  hospital visits, and eliminating the need to seek medical treatment for minor treatments, such as suture/ staple
  removal, ear flushing, wound care, and more.


